Do Como Right

After my fiancé and I spent a week in Lake Garda a couple of summers ago, hiking the Alps, swimming at Spiaggia Sabbioni, eating our weight in pistachio gelato, and drinking too many Negronis, I've wanted to get back to this Lombardian lake region. Last summer was out, what with all the Christo madness on Lake Iseo, but this year we're eyeing Como. I knew we had to lock down the details for high season earlier than we did with Garda. Specialists like Andrea Grisdale said we should book private boats (most of Como's sites are best approached by water) and guides at least six months out—which will mean being able to get to and from Isola Comacina on our own timetable, and nabbing a terrace seat at Trattoria del Porto for missoltini con polenta. We haven't decided whether we'll try for a waterfront room at the new Il Sereno, a suite at the Art Nouveau Grand Hotel Tremezzo (which made our "Readers' Choice Awards" in November), or one of seven modern apartments at the sixteenth-century Villa Pliniana, but it's nice to still have options. San Diego 2.0

Long known for Sea-World and family vacations, San Diego has evolved. Some interesting openings-and 70° days this monthbumped it up on our list of late-to-book winter escapes (East Coasters, you can fly direct from JFK and Logan for under \$250). Check out the Mexican-inflected Barrio Logan, which pulsates with modern art (of note: Chicano Park's colossal murals). Plus Liberty Public Market is a new artisanal food hub: The fish taco at Cecilia's Taqueria is as good as the classic crab and ovsters on the Pacific Beach boardwalk. It may not be warm enough for a dip, but hike Torrey Pines State Natural Reserve to see migrating gray whales from the clifftops. Best of all, the new Montage-owned Pendry San Diego hotel has 317 California-breezy rooms with images by surf photography pioneer A.R.
